Montpellier is a city in perpetual movement, and is a place of passion, confluence and sharing. Here, people come from all over the world to live to the rhythm of festivals: extreme sports, Montpellier Dance Festival, Architectures Vives festival, performing arts, city-centre illuminations festival... Events designed by and for enthusiasts... always a smart combination of performance and aesthetics.

Wholeheartedly Mediterranean, Montpellier shines bright and radiates: set in an ideal geographical location, just 10km from the seaside, surrounded by endless vineyards and lush countryside. Local hidden jewels, Villeneuve-lès-Maguelone and its Romanesque cathedral standing proud between vineyards and lagoons, charming fishermen's huts in Pérols, the nearby Camargue countryside... Exceptional playgrounds for nature-lovers and fans of "slow tourism"...

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ENJOY A DRINK ON THE FAMOUS PLACE DE LA COMÉDIE

Located in the heart of Montpellier, the Place de la Comédie is THE place to be! Formerly known as the "egg" (Place de l'oeuf) due to its oval shape, and dominated by the Comédie opera house, this is one of Europe's most extensive pedestrian areas. In the centre of the square, the "3 Graces" fountain, created in 1773, reigns supreme. A great place to soak up the city's vibes!





A pedestrian-friendly destination, enjoy discovering Montpellier on foot, bicycle or tram. Leave stress and noise behind. Here, cars are not welcome in the city-centre. Upon arrival at St Roch station, visitors are immediately immersed in a vast pedestrian area. The thrill of discovery is all the more intense, with street artists and buzzing café terraces from which to watch the permanent ballet of the 4 colourful tram lines serving the city.

TAKE A DEEP BREATH OF FRESH ART

A preference for fine art or contemporary art...? Not to be missed: the Fabre Museum, considered as one of Europe's most beautiful Fine Arts museums, with European works from the Renaissance to the present day, and a full wing dedicated to contemporary artist, Pierre Soulages. And the MOCO, a brand new contemporary art centre that opened its doors in June 2019, showing temporary

from international collectors. Lovers of urban culture must not miss the Halle Tropisme, newly installed in the Creative City which has taken up residence in a series of former army warehouses.




The ancient city-centre of Montpellier is packed with winding, medieval streets, a symbol of its proud past. Rue de la Valfère, rue du Bras de Fer, rue de la Argenterie all offer visitors a taste of bygone times.

The very best way to discover them? Leave the map behind, and just enjoy discovering the aura of these narrow streets. On the agenda, a fun shopping spree in boutiques with vaulted ceilings, which alone are worth the visit and a trip back in time, where designers, antique dealers, tea rooms and galleries abound!

TAKE IN THE SURROUNDING COUNTRYSIDE

Montpellier Méditerranée offers a kaleidoscope of colour and atmospheres. The landscape around the central city of Montpellier is a genuine ode to nature: vineyards, hiking trails, sandy beaches, the nearby Pic Saint Loup, all less than an hour away, along with picturesque Languedoc villages... The best place to discover the panorama of landscapes? From the top of the triumphal arch or water tower.





GETTING AWAY FROM IT ALL ON AN ARCHITECTURAL JOURNEY

Visitors to Montpellier are immediately struck by its vibrant diversity. Each district of the city is unique and distinct, illustrating the city's 1,000-year old history. A clever mix of ancient and contemporary architecture, from medieval alleys to architectural masterpieces by top international architects, including Jean Nouvel, Zaha Hadid, Massimiliano Fuksas, and many more! Starck's latest creation is also a must-see: Le Nuage, also l'Arbre Blanc by Sou Foukimoto or the Folie Divine by London architect, Farshid Moussavi.

LE JARDIN DES SENS

Renaissance of a Montpellier institution

The mythical "Jardin des Sens" (3* in the Michelin guide) created by famous chefs the POURCEL brothers, is set to reopen its doors in spring 2020, at Place de la Canourgue, within the former Montpellier Town Hall, named Hôtel Richer de Belleval, a 17th century historical building. This Relais & Châteaux luxury establishment will include 18 rooms, a gourmet restaurant, bistro, champagne bar, reception facility (in the former wedding hall) and outdoor terrace. A contemporary art gallery will also be part of the ensemble.

Gastronomy & Audacity

L'ARBRE BLANC

Architecture brings a glow to gastronomy

Opened in June 2019 on the banks of the river Lez, the Arbre Blanc, designed by architects Sou Fujimoto, Nicolas Laisné and Manal Rachdi, makes a bold statement on Montpellier's architectural audacity. Muchloved by gourmets and architecture-buffs, the ground and first floor of the building hosts a brand new chefs brasserie by Charles FONTES (La Réserve Rimbaud) and Eric CELLIER (La Maison de la Lozère). An art gallery and tapas bar on one of the 17th floor panoramic terraces, complete the experience.

artistic ecosystem, with two exhibition centres and an art school: the Hôtel des collections, with exhibitions of international collections (public or private), La Panacée, contemporary art centre, and the ESBA (Montpellier Superior Fine Arts School).

MOCO Hôtel des collections is Montpellier Contemporary's main, centrally located hub. The cultural platform was inaugurated in June 2019 in the former

Hôtel Montcalm. The centre does not host a permanent collection, but exhibits public or private collections from all over the world. Whether collective, individual, topical or historical, each exhibition showcases a specific collec-

tion: that of a foundation, a private collector, a company, a museum, or even an artist. Most of the collections shown here have never been seen by the general public before. More than just an exhibition centre, MOCO Hôtel des Collections is a bright, buzzing hub. Ideally set in a garden with


plant life from five continents, open to the general public, the MOCO also has its own bar and boutique.

LA HALLE TROPISME A creative city in former army warehouses

The Creative City is a new 4,000m² hall, dedicated to cultural and creative industries, and set to bloom and grow in the coming years. The 1913 building, home to the army's mechanical workshops, is now a centre for entrepreneurship and the arts, hosting daily events for the general public who meet for a drink in the cosy, welcoming Café Tropisme. This ecosystem brings together all those involved in Montpellier's art scene, and more broadly the Cultural and Creative Industries. Connected, combined, creative, inspiring...



THE MEDITERRANEAN BY BIKE A fun, family bike ride from Montpellier!

The cycling route begins in the centre of Montpellier, heading out towards the neoclassical district of Antigone, then Port Marianne from where to discover the architectural prowess of some of the greatest architects of the moment. Once you reach the Jean Nouvel designed town hall, then follow the cycle path along the river Lez, between vineyards and lagoons.

At the end of the ten-kilometre cycle path is the Mediterranean Sea cycle trail... flat, secured and ideal for family getaways! From the trail, on the Palavas-Sète section, make a detour to Maguelone Cathedral. Discover a natural, seaside haven! Visit Maguelone Cathedral and enjoy winetasting on the estate in an idyllic setting. Complete the day with a fun, family dip in the sea.

Location-Access

MONTPELLIER MEDITERRANEE At the heart of the Mediterranean Arc

Ideally located at just 1h15 by plane from Paris, 3h from Barcelona, 11km from the Mediterranean, in the heart of the Occitanie region and close to Provence, Montpellier Méditerranée is an ideal destination for exploring an historic city, a multifaceted hinterland and some of the most prestigious sites in world heritage.

By air

Montpellier is easily accessible by plane with many direct flights: 1h10 from Paris, 1h15 from Basel, 1h45 from London and 1h55 from Amsterdam. The airport is only 8km from the city centre and offers direct flights to 8 French

Montpellier is served by 17 airlines: including AirFrance, Air Arabia, KLM, British Airways, Royal Air Maroc, Easyjet, Transavia, Volotea...

Coming in 2020: in April 2020, Transavia is setting up a permanent hub in Montpellier with direct access to 20 mediterranean destinations.

By rail


Montpellier has two stations: Montpellier Saint-Roch station, located in the city-centre, 200 metres from the Place de la Comédie and Montpellier Sud de France station, and the TGV train station (20 minutes from the city-centre, accessible by tramway and shuttle bus).

Many direct connections to Paris-Gare de Lyon station or Charles de Gaulle airport (3h15), Lille (4h45), Barcelona or Brussels (5h40).

By road

Just 1h30 from Marseille - 2h30 from Toulouse - 3h from Lyon - 3h30 from Barcelona - 3h15 from Nice, Montpellier is served by the A9/ A709 and A75 motorways, the Montpellier Méditerranée International Airport, located 8km from the city centre and Montpellier Saint-Roch station in the city-centre, just 200 metres from the Place de la Comédie.


