THE TRAMWAY DESIGN AND HAUTE COUTURE



Not only are Montpellier's trams gentle, environmentally-friendly means of transport, they're also real walking works of art! Did you know? The 4 lines refer to the 4 elements, line 1 'Air' designed by Garouste and Bonetti, line 2 celebrates 'earth' with its flowers, Christian Lacroix designed line 3 'water' with its underwater decorations and line 4 'fire' with trains dedicated to the Sun King.

MOBILITY

MAJOR WORKS FORCARBON-FREE MOBILITY

Montpellier Méditerranée Métropole is spending €1.5 billion on transport between now and 2026. This is an unprecedented level of investment needed to create line 5 of the tramway, extend line 1 of the tramway to the Sud de France TGV station, build 5 bustram lines and 235 km of express cycle network, the 'Vélolignes montpelliéraines'.

THE 5TH TRAM LINE 20 DECEMBER 2025



From the town of Clapiers to Lavérune, this 16-kilometre line will run from the north to the south-west of the Metropole. It will also link the various parks and gardens (notably the Jardin des Plantes, Parc Clemenceau, Parc Montcalm, Parc Bagatelle and Parc du Lunaret). Barthélémy Togo, an artist from Cameroon, created the design. He called the work Feuille de vie (Leaf of Life). It features the head of a man in profile, mouth open, from which plants are emerging. After the 4 elements for the first four lines (air, earth, water and fire), the theme of line 5 is nature, botany and the plant world.

EXTENSION OF TRAM LINE 1 TO SUD DE FRANCE TGV STATION

This line will link Sud de France station to Saint-Roch station. Opening OCTOBER 2025

2025 A NEW STYLE OF TRANSPORT COMING SOON TO MONTPELLIER



Committed to an eco-responsible policy, the city of Montpellier is doing its utmost to accelerate the ecological transition and decarbonise mobility. Following on from the new tramway line planned for 2025, Montpellier will be developing a new style of transport that is even more respectful of the environment, with 5 BusTram lines. This new means of transport is a good alternative to the car, making it more environmentally-friendly and more economical. The 57 km route will serve 10 communes - 1st section June 2025*.

'VELOLIGNES MONTPELLIERAINES', THE EXPRESS BICYCLE NETWORK LINKING THE COMMUNES OF THE METROPOLIS

To complete the network of existing measures (construction of cycle paths, assistance with the purchase of an electrically-assisted bicycle, assistance with repairs, etc.), the Metropole aims to create a Cycle Express Network, called 'Vélolignes Montpellieraines', linking several communes in the Metropole.

Comprising more than 235 km, this new alternative to the car, in addition to the tramway, bus, bustram and TER train, represents a further step towards the necessary ecological and solidarity-based transition.



It plays an active role in preserving air quality, and therefore the health of local residents and their purchasing power, as well as calming down towns and villages and creating a city at children's level.

A number of major projects launched by the city are coming to an end this year. In autumn, Montpellier will be even more beautiful!

Work on the Place de la Comédie has been completed, and the Place des Martyrs de la Résistance will be unveiled on 26 November. The esplanade Charles-de-Gaulle has also been given a facelift with its new fountains. After 4 years of major works to embellish the city, involving an investment of €50 million, 2 phases of deliveries are planned.

BOSC KIOSK

Renovation of the bandstand on the esplanade. It will be completed on 21 June for the Fête de la Musique.


CARRÉ SAINTE-ANNE

A municipal exhibition space dedicated to contemporary art since 1991, Carré Sainte-Anne is being reinvented. Its reopening is scheduled for JUNE 2025.

A landmark of Montpellier, the former church of Sainte-Anne is the tallest building in the Écusson (66 metres). The neo-Gothic building was constructed between 1866

and 1872, on the site of a former 12th-century church. Deconsecrated at the end of the 1980s, it was transformed by the town council into an exhibition space dedicated to contemporary art: the Carré Sainte-Anne. For

For more than 25 years, the immense 600 m2 nave has offered a demanding artistic approach, with off-the-beaten-track proposals. The space has welcomed many major artists, including Marc Desgrandchamps, Gérard Garouste, Bernard Pagès, Hervé Di Rosa, Manuel Ocampo and Gérard Othoniel.



In 2017, the venue had to close its doors because its structure had become too fragile.

On 27th June, Carré Saint-Anne reopens with an exhibition by street artist JR, known for his large-format portraits exhibited in public spaces. public spaces. It will be a participatory exhibition with the artist.

HORIZON RESORT MASSANE ** IN BAILLARGUES**



After 4 years of work and €33 million of investment, Horizon Resort Massane has just opened its doors. Located in Baillargues, on the outskirts of Montpellier, this hotel complex belongs to the Eoden group.

The complex covers an area of 9,000 m2, making it one of the largest in the Montpellier region. Horizon Resort Massane now offers a wider range of facilities, including accommodation, restaurants, golf and wellness. The Resort has 84 rooms, including six suites, and 39 flats, ranging from T2 to T3, suitable for different types of stay. The rooms are bathed in natural light, and all have south-east-facing terraces overlooking the golf course.

terraces overlooking the golf course. Villa Massane also boasts a private garden and swimming pool, as well as additional services such as an in-house chef and sports coach. chef or sports coach.

The Massane golf course, already renowned for its 9- and 18-hole courses designed in 1988 by architect Ronald Fream, has also been renovated. This modernisation work hasimproved the existing infrastructure, including a covered wooden driving range equipped with swing analysis technology.

The Zéphyr spa covers 700 m2 and includes a hammam, sauna, indoor pool and solarium. Four treatment rooms are also available for massages and other treatments. The resort is also equipped with a modern 150 m2 gym and a 130 m2 room dedicated to group classes, offering a wide range of physical activities. offering a wide range of physical activities. For professionals, a 1,000 m2 business centre with ten modular rooms can accommodate seminars and events of all sizes. events of all sizes. The 'Au fil des collections' exhibitions in winter 2025 will feature two French artists whose work will be in eloquent dialogue with the museum's collections: Dominique De Beir, who has made a generous donation to the Metropole of Montpellier in 2023, and Pierre Buraglio.

For several weeks, Buraglio has been working in the museum's galleries, reinterpreting some of his masterpieces in a process of gradual distancing that began in the 1990s. His work will be compared with the source works, from different periods, in three of the museum's galleries. As for Dominique De Beir, the collection that entered the museum last year will be set against sculptures, drawings and paintings from the museum, which the artist has freely chosen. This fruitful carte blanche will be on display in five of the museum's rooms, including the majestic Richier atrium.

Pierre Soulages, La Rencontre / Unmissable



From 27 June 2025 to January 2026

To celebrate the 20th anniversary of the exceptional donation of twenty paintings by Pierre Soulages to the Musée Fabre in Montpellier, making it one of the leading museums for the artist, a major retrospective will be presented from 28 June 2025 to 4 January 2026, dedicated to the painter from Aveyron who died in 2022.

This will be the first major exhibition devoted to this artist in Montpellier. The project will cover more than 1,000 m² and will create continuity between the exhibition rooms and the Soulages rooms and the permanent Soulages galleries at the Musée Fabre.

With 200 winegrowers covering almost 3,000 hectares, Montpellier's vineyards form an intimate link between town and country. The Metropolis of Montpellier is the world's second-largest agronomic research area, concentrating more than half of the world's wine research and hosting a vine and wine research cluster that is unique in Europe (250 researchers and engineers in oenology, viticulture and the socio-economics of wine).

The Domaine de Vassal collection held at the INRA centre in Montpellier is the largest in the world for Vitis vinifera L., the European species of vine cultivated vine. It is also a conservatory of 3,000 grape varieties, the only one of its kind in the world.

ZOOM ON... A LITTLE HISTORY

From the triumph of the phylloxera crisis to the drama of the great winegrowers' revolt of 1907, the history of wine in our region is intimately linked to all the men and women who, although outside the world of wine, have left their mark on it: Arnaud de Villeneuve, Rabelais and his dive bouteille, Jacques Coeur, Edouard Adam, who improved the still in the 17th century, and Planchon, who discovered phylloxera on 15/07/1868...

Square Planchon, opposite the Gare Saint-Roch; the bust guarding the entrance to the square is that of the illustrious botanist Planchon, the providential scientist from Montpellier who, with his team, saved the French vineyards during the phylloxera crisis.



Emblematic places like the Faculty of Medicine, from which you can listen to the portrait of a chemist who had a lot to do with wine, are also worth a visit. the portrait of a well-known chemist: Jean-Antoine Chaptal, the graduate from Montpellier who gave his name to chaptalization, a process used to increase the alcohol content of the alcohol content of wines.

Occitanie is the largest wine region in France, and Hérault is the 2nd organic wine department. The appellation AOC Languedoc-Grès de Montpellier covers the vineyards in and around the conurbation of Montpellier, or 12,000 hectares in production of which 1,000 are classified AOC Languedoc - Grés de Montpellier. The main grape varieties are grenache, mourvèdre, syrah, carignan, cinsault, viognier, roussanne and marsanne.

In 1787, the young American ambassador to France, Thomas Jefferson, on a visit to the region, cited the wine of Saint-Georges d'Orques as one of the best tasted in France. When he became President of the United States, he put this wine on the White House table.



THE FACULTY OF MEDICINE

Successively a Benedictine monastery founded in the 14th century, a bishop's palace and then a health school, the Faculty of Medicine was founded in 1220, making it the oldest medical school in the Western world still in operation. It celebrated its 800th anniversary in 2020. The Conservatoire d'Anatomie houses almost 5,600 anatomical specimens and wax models for teaching purposes.

The Conservatoire d'Anatomie is currently closed for renovation as is the Musée Atger.

As the cradle of medical education, Montpellier owes its renown to its faculty, the oldest medical school in the Western world.

The oldest medical school in the western world has never ceased to function. Montpellier's rich history is such that the city is planning to have it declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

DID YOU KNOW?

AN ASTONISHING EDICT

Montpellier was less than two centuries old when, in 1180, its lord, Guilhem VIII, signed an astonishing edict. It stipulated that anyone, whatever their origin or religion religion, had the right to teach medicine in Montpellier. Thus was born the Faculty of Medicine, and with it the destiny of the city.

THE CONSERVATORY OF ANATOMY

Initially intended for teaching anatomy, the conservatory was an incredible teaching tool for generations of students before today's techniques for exploring the human body. The collection, comprising almost 5,600 anatomical parts and waxes, has been a listed historic monument since 2004.

HEALTH, A RICH HISTORY

From its very beginnings, medicine has played a key role in Montpellier's development as demonstrated by the the Faculty of Medicine. A tradition that goes back thousands of years more than ever in the present and the future.

Born in Cos, Hippocrates is now a native of Montpellier The cradle of medical education for eight centuries. It has famous pupils, including François Rabelais, Nostradamus, and teachers such as Arnaud de Villeneuve and Gui de Chauliac, whose names are still today. A historical legacy that the region and developed to become a benchmark in the field.





THE PLANT GARDEN



The Royal Garden of Montpellier was created by edict in 1593. It is the oldest establishment of its kind in France. Today, it is still visited by a large number of botanists, doctors, pharmacists and students, as well as plant lovers and tourists, ever since it opened to the public in 1841. The garden has undergone a series of changes from the 16th century to the present day, including a pond (populated by frogs) and an English-style landscaped garden dating from the Second Empire.

MISERICORDE PHARMACY AND CHAPEL

The historic Miséricorde complex is home to the last remaining apothecary in Montpellier. Since the departure of the Sisters of Charity of Saint-Vincent de Paul in 2001, this place of remembrance, a listed historic monument, has been managed by the City of Montpellier. The pharmacy, comprising two rooms (the eighteenth-century officine and the nineteenth-century offcine), contains a rare collection of monster pots, canon pots, jugs and chevrettes, testifying to several centuries of Montpellier earthenware.



THE MIKVE



Montpellier's medieval mikveh, dating from the 13th century, is one of the oldest and best preserved in Europe. Located in the old Jewish quarter, it bears witness to the historical and cultural importance of the city's Jewish community.

This ritual purification bath is fed by underground water, which flows through a gargoyle, symbolising passage and purification.

The entrance is via a 15-step staircase leading up to the undressing area, before the pool below is revealed 7 steps further down through a geminated window. The architecture features Romanesque elements, in particular a geminated bay with a column and round arches.


